Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

2 Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards(Ind AS) notified under section 133 of companies act 2013 ("ACT") read with Companies(Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015; and the other provisions of the act and rules thereafter. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under historical cost convention basis, except for certain financial

The company financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees (₹) All figures appearing in the financial statement are rounded to the nearest Indian Rupees (₹), except where otherwise indicated.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions to be made (B) <u>Use of Judgements & Estimates</u> that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the result are known / materialised.

(C) Revenue Recognition

 - v) Intangible aseets aquired seperately are measued on initial recognition at cost. Following initial recognition, intangible assets are amortis over their respective individual estimated useful lifes on straight line method.
