Report on the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

I have audited the accompanying standalone Ind AS financial statements of RR INSURANCE BROKERS PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2019, and the statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), Statement of changes in equity and Statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In my opinion and to the best of my information and according to the explanations given to me, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act")in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("Ind AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31 March 2019, and its profit, total comprehensive income, its cash flows and the changes in equity for the year ended on that date.

1 Corporate overview

2 Significant Accounting Policies

(A) Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

in accordance with the notification issued by Ministry of corporate Affairs, the company has adopted Indian Accounting Standards (referred to as "Ind AS" notified under the companies (Indian accounting stendards) Rules, 2015 with effect from April 1, 2017, Previous figures have been restated to find As, in accordance with IndAS 101 First time adoption of Indian accounting standards, the company has presented a reconciliation from the preparation of financial stetements Accounting Standards notified by Companies (Accounting Btandards) Rules 2016 ("previous GAAP) to Ind AS of shareholders equify as at march 31, 2017 and April 1, 2016 and for the comprehensive net income for the year ended March 31,2017.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under section 133 of companies act 2013 ("ACT") mad with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015; and the other provisions of the act and rules thereefor.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under historical cost convention basis, except for certain financial instruments measured. At fair value,

The company financial statements are presented in Indian Rupoos (₹) All figures appearing in the financial statement are rounded to the nearest Indian Rupees (₹), except

(B) Use of Judgements & Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with ind AS requires the Managoment to make estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the result are known / materialised.

(C) Bevenue Recognition

Income is being accounted for on accrual basis

Revenue is recognized to the extent that is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the group and revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment and excluding taxes and duties collected on behalf of government. The revenue is recognized net of QST(in any)

(D) Property, plant and equipment

- i) Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairement losses if any.
- ii) The initial cost of an Fixed Assets are stated at cost, including freight, installation, duties and taxes, finance charges and other incidental expenses incurred during construction or installation to bring the assets to their state of intended use.
- iii) The company has elected to use the exemption available under ind AS 101 to continue the carrying value of all of its property, plant and equipments as recognised in the financial statements as the date of transation of Ind AS, measured as per previous GAAP and use that as its deemed cost on date of transation (1st April 2017).
- iv) Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is provided on the Straight Line Method by considering the revised useful life of the assets(after retaining the estimated residual value of upto 5%) in the manner prescribed under schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.
- Intengible essets aquired seperately are measued on initial recognition at cost. Following initial recognition, intengible assets are amortised over their respective individual
 estimated useful lifes on straight line method. The company has elected to continue with the carrying value for all its intengible assets as recognised in its Indian GAAP
 linencials as deemed cost as at the transition date (1st April 2017).

(E) Impairment of Non Financial Assets

Impairment loss is provided; if any, to the extent, the carrying amount of assets exceed their recoverable amount. Recoverable amount is higher of an asset's net selling price and its value in use. Value in use is the present value of estimated future cash flows expected to arise from the continuing use of an asset and from its disposal at the end of its

Impairment losses recognised in prior years are reversed when there is an indication that the impairment losses recognised no longer exist or have decreased. Such reversals are recognised as an increase in carrying amount of assets to the extent that it does not exceed the carrying amounts that would been determined (net of amortisation or depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised in provious years.

(f) Valuation of investment

investments are valued at adquisition cost Provision is made for diminution in the value of investment which is perceived to be of permanent nature.

(g) Inventedes

Stocks of quoted share /dobentures and other securitiess, are valued at fair price, but where the fair value is not available, we consider the fast value provided.

Stocks of unquoted shares/deponture and other securities valued at fair fair value to the extent possible.

The difference between the felt value of inventory and the cost price or market price which ever is lower recognised in Other comprehensive income.

(H) Investment in subsidiaries, Joint ventures and Associates

Investment in equity shares of subsidiaries, joint ventures and associates are recorded at cost.

A financial instrument is any contract that gives rise to a financial assets to one entity and financial liability to exether entity.

(l.1) <u>Financial Assots</u>

Financial assets at amortised cost: Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortised cost.

These are presented as current assets, except for those maturing later than 12 months after the reporting date, which are presented as non-current assets. Financial assets are measured initially at fair value plus transaction cost.

Financial assets at amortised cost are represented by trade receivable, security deposits, cash and cash equivalent; employee and other advances.

Financial assets at tair value through other comprehensive income(FVTQCI): All equity investments are measured at fair value, investments which are held for trading purpose/investment purpose and where the company has exercised the option to classify the investments as fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTQCI), all fair value changes on the investments are recognised in QCI. The accumulated gain or losses recognised in QCI are classified to retained earnings on sale of such investments.

Financial liabilities

initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value and in case of joen and borrowings net of directly attributable costs.

Financial disbilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost. For trade and other payable maturity within one year from the balance sheet date, the carrying value approximates fair value due to short insturity of these instruments.

(J) Investment Property

Investment property is property (and or a building-or part of a building-or both) held either to earn rental income or for capital appreciation or for both, but not for sale in ordinary course of business. Investment properties are stated at cost net of accumisted depreciation and accumisted impairement tesses, if any.

(K) Taxation

(K.1) Current income tax

Current income lax essets and lispilities are measured at the amount expected to be recovered from or pold to the taxation authority. The tax rates and tax taws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date. Current tax items are recognised in correlation to the underlying transaction either in the statement of Profit and less, other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

(K.2) Deferred Tax

Deferred Tax is provided using balance sheet method on temporary difference between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amount for financial reporting purposes at the reporting deto.

Deferred tax itabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the flability is settled or assets realized, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or subsequently enacted at the end of reporting period. The carrying amount of Deferred tax itabilities and assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period.

- (ii) A deferred lax asset is recognised for unclaimed MAT credits that are cerried forward as deferred tax assets.
- (L) Gratuity is being provided on cash basis.

(M) Foreign Currency Transaction

- i) Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rates prevailing at the time of transaction.
- ii) Monetary items denominated in foreign currencies at the year-end are translated at the year end rate, the resultant gain or loss will be recognized in the statement of profit and loss account.
- iii) Any gein or loss arising on account of exchange difference on settlement of transaction is recognized in the statement of profit and loss account.

(N) Provision and contingencies

The company creates a provision when there exists a present obligation as a result of past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not require an outflow of resources, when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision of disclosure is made.

(O) Research and Development

Reyonue expenditure on research and development is charged as an expense in the year in which it is incurred under respective heads of accounts. Expenditure which results in the creation of capital exacts is capitalised and depreciation is provided on such assets as applicable.

(P) Earnings por share
